WHEREAS, one of the primary functions of local governments is to protect the health, safety and welfare of its people; **AND**

WHEREAS, in exercising its role to carry-out the above, the West Baton Rouge Parish Council utilizes its police powers under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana; **AND**

WHEREAS, such exercise of police power involves from time-to-time creating or amending local development laws in order to protect the public; **AND**

WHEREAS, the West Baton Rouge Parish Council is taking action on zoning districts where Construction Sales and Services would be permitted for development in the unincorporated areas of West Baton Rouge Parish; **AND**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the West Baton Rouge Parish Code of Ordinances, Part III (“Unified Development Code”), Chapter 101 (“General Provisions”), Section 101-1 (“Definitions”), and Chapter 104 (“Zoning Ordinance”), Appendix A (“Zoning Districts”) be amended and readopted to read as follows:

Sec. 101-1 Definitions

Construction sales and services means establishments or places of business primarily engaged in construction activities and incidental storage on lots other than construction sites, includes minor machinery and equipment repairs, as well as the retail or wholesale sale, from the premises, of materials used in the construction of buildings or other structures other than retail sale of paint,

fixtures and hardware. Excludes construction materials plants, as defined herein. Typical uses include building materials stores, lumberyards, tool and equipment rental or sales, or building contractors.

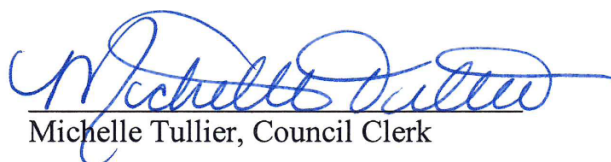

An Ordinance To Amend And Reenact The West Baton Rouge Parish Code Of Ordinances, Part III (“Unified Development Code”), Chapter 109 (“Property Maintenance”), Article II (“Unlawful Vegetation, Trash And Debris”), Section 109-19 (“High Weeds, Grass, Trash And Debris In Certain Areas”), To Clarify And Expedite Vegetative Maintenance Nuisance Enforcement In The Unincorporated Areas Of West Baton Rouge Parish.

WHEREAS, one of the primary functions of local governments is to protect the health, safety and welfare of its people; **AND**

WHEREAS, in exercising its role to carry-out the above, the West Baton Rouge Parish Council utilizes its police powers under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana; **AND**

WHEREAS, such exercise of police power involves from time-to-time creating or amending local development laws in order to protect the public; **AND**

WHEREAS, the West Baton Rouge Council continues to find that poorly maintained vegetation - on properties other than true agricultural land uses - constitutes a community nuisance; **AND**

WHEREAS, the West Baton Rouge Parish Council wishes to clarify and expedite its enforcement of nuisance management in this area of the law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the West Baton Rouge Parish Code of Ordinances, Part III (“Unified Development Code”), Chapter 109 (“Property Maintenance”), Article II (“Unlawful Vegetation, Trash and Debris”), Section 109-19 (“High weeds, grass, trash and debris in certain areas”) be amended and readopted to read as follows:

CHAPTER 109

ARTICLE II. – UNLAWFUL VEGETATION, TRASH AND DEBRIS

* * *

Sec. 109-19. High weeds, grass, trash and debris in certain areas.

* * *

(b) *Notice to remove.* If the owners of such lot, place or area, vacant or with structures located thereon, fail to cut and remove said grass or weeds which exceed nine inches or more in height; or noxious growth, trash or other debris, the parish president or his designee shall dispatch a certified letter to the property owners requiring them to cut the grass and/or weeds; and/or remove, legally and completely from the premises, any and all noxious growths, trash or other debris. In addition to the certified letter and in an effort to expedite nuisance abatement, proper notice ~~shall~~ may also consist of one or more of the following: an additional, alternative notification method as delineated here: standard U.S. regular mail ~~along with publication one time in the official journal of the Parish, and/or~~ posting for ten consecutive days on the official Parish website, and/or posting for five consecutive days with a sign at least one square foot in area within the road right-of-way of the property being investigated.

* * *

(e) *Only one notice required per calendar year.* In order to handle vegetation nuisance cases in a timely manner consistent with public health, safety and welfare, only one (1) initial, certified letter shall be required per year sent to the alleged offender as prescribed elsewhere. Further alleged violations beyond the initial annual violation notice shall be remedied with service to be satisfied by only ~~publication one time in the official journal of the Parish, and~~ posting for five (5) consecutive days on the official Parish website, and posting for five (5) consecutive days with a sign at least one square foot in area within the road right-of-way of the property being investigated. In the initial certified letter, the alleged violator shall be notified that they will not receive any additional letters for additional alleged violations in the same calendar year. The amount of time to remedy subsequent alleged violations after the initial one shall be five (5) calendar days from the date the sign is posted on the property provided that ~~the journal publication and the website posting~~ has already taken place as well.

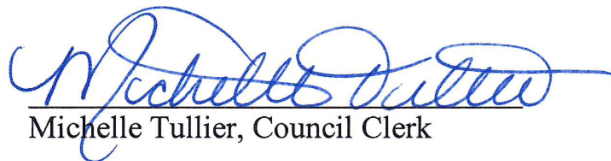

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the West Baton Rouge Parish Council that all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed in their entirety

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Parish Council of the Parish of West Baton Rouge, Louisiana, that if any provision or item of this ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or application of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

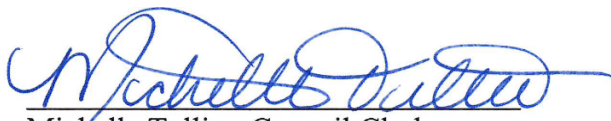

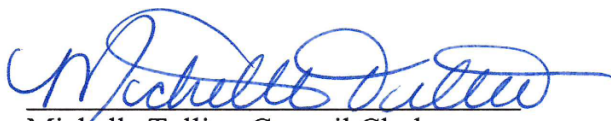
